THIS POSTER HIGHLIGHTS RESEARCH EXAMINING CIS AND TRANS WOMEN'S UNDERSTANDING OF THEIR HIV RISK, AS WELL AS THEIR AWARENESS AND ACCESS TO HIV PREVENTION MEDICATIONS SUCH AS PREP, PEP, AND PIP. THE FINDINGS HIGHLIGHT IMPORTANT GAPS IN AWARENESS AND OPPORTUNITIES TO STRENGTHEN WOMEN-CENTRED HIV PREVENTION EDUCATION AND ACCESS.

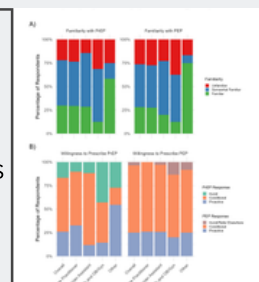

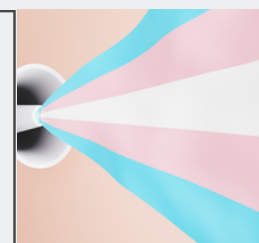
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PREP IS FOR TRANS PEOPLE TOO. WHY IS ACCESS STILL FALLING SHORT?

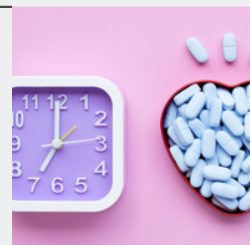

THIS RAPID RESPONSE REPORT EXAMINES AWARENESS, ACCESSIBILITY, AND UPTAKE OF HIV PREP AMONG CISGENDER AND TRANSGENDER WOMEN AT RISK OF HIV, HIGHLIGHTING PERSISTENT GAPS IN KNOWLEDGE AND ACCESS. IT IDENTIFIES BARRIERS AND PROMISING APPROACHES FOR IMPROVING PREP AWARENESS AND MAKING PREVENTION SERVICES MORE ACCESSIBLE, INCLUSIVE, AND RESPONSIVE TO THE NEEDS OF DIVERSE WOMEN.

HIV POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS (PEP) AND PEP-IN-POCKET (PIP) FOR WOMEN: A RODGERS' EVOLUTIONARY CONCEPT ANALYSIS

THIS REVIEW EXAMINES HIV POST-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS (PEP) AND PEP-IN-POCKET (PIP) AS WOMEN-CENTRED HIV PREVENTION STRATEGIES, EXPLORING HOW THESE APPROACHES CAN SUPPORT TIMELY ACCESS, AUTONOMY, AND GREATER CHOICE IN HIV PREVENTION. IT HIGHLIGHTS IMPORTANT GAPS IN RESEARCH AND IMPLEMENTATION, PARTICULARLY FOR CIS AND TRANS WOMEN, AND CALLS FOR MORE EQUITABLE, PERSON-CENTRED PREVENTION OPTIONS.

THIS CATIE STATEMENT SUMMARIZES EVIDENCE ON PREP AS AN EFFECTIVE HIV PREVENTION OPTION FOR PEOPLE WHO USE DRUGS, INCLUDING PEOPLE WHO MAY FACE HIV RISK THROUGH SEXUAL ACTIVITY OR SHARING DRUG-USE EQUIPMENT. IT HIGHLIGHTS BARRIERS TO PREP ACCESS AND OFFERS GUIDANCE FOR SERVICE PROVIDERS ON INTEGRATING HIV PREVENTION WITH HARM REDUCTION, SUPPORTIVE CARE, AND OTHER COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES.

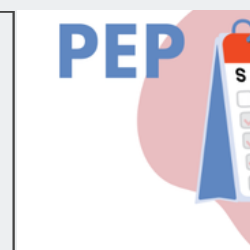

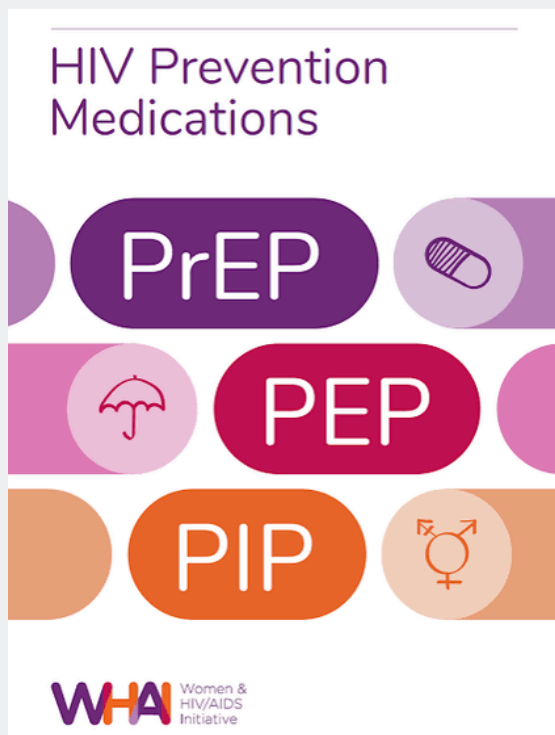
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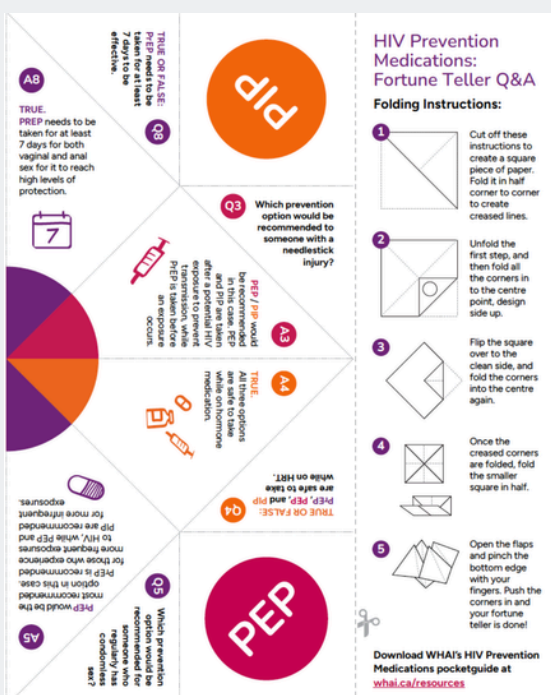
